

AWA BEGINS WATER LINE RELOCATION PROJECT IN SUTTER CREEK

(Sutter Creek) The Amador Water Agency is notifying Sutter Creek residents of construction that will be occurring on Broad Street over the next few months.

The City of Sutter Creek will be constructing a new storm water diversion system on Broad Street this summer which will improve drainage and relieve pressure on the existing facilities. The City's project requires the Water Agency and PG&E to relocate water lines running through Broad Street by May 1, 2012.

During the month of December, the Agency's Construction Department will be in the area making preparations to begin the project. Construction activities will begin in January. Construction will take place on Broad Street from Eureka Street to Gopher Flat Road and the intersections of Broadway and Randolph.

"The Agency's Construction Department will make every effort to minimize the inconvenience to area residents and families attending the Sutter Creek Primary School," said Chris McKeage, AWA field services manager. During construction, crews will cover trenches with plates each evening so that residents may access their driveways.

Broad Street will be barricaded at the Broad Street and Gopher Flat Road intersection during working hours. Alternative drop off and pick up procedures for parents of children attending Sutter Creek Primary have been communicated to parents through the school's newsletter. Parents should contact the school with any questions.
